<u>Chromebooks</u> – Can we also ask that you remind children to take greater care with their bags when carrying chromebooks in them. We will also continue to give this message in school.

<u>Indoor Shoes</u> – There are quite a number of children who do not have indoor shoes. Can you please check this with your child as they need them for wearing in class and also for gym sessions.
