Gloves should not be worn unless the temperature is very cold. If the weather necessitates the wearing of gloves then it is **essential** that they are washed after the farm visit to eliminate risk of cross contamination. Gloves will be removed at the handwash time, bagged up and sent home for washing.

#### **Archie Foundation**


As part of their work in supporting families the Archie Foundation are looking for volunteers.

#### Open Afternoon (P1-7 only although ELC by request)

On Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> November we will be holding an open afternoon. You are welcome to come into school any time between 1:30pm and 3pm. This is a drop in session rather than a start time and end time.

**ELC** are not part of this event but please remember that parents are welcome at any time to come in and be part of a session. We feel that this is a better



If however, you are in school for the open afternoon and it fits in well for you to visit ELC at the same time please let us know and we will arrange this.

<u>Format</u> - The format for our open session will remain the same as these have been developed with staff, parent and child feedback over the previous 8 years before the pandemic. We feel this is a successful format. This is part of our engagement with families throughout the year. As well as our open session we issue Learning Profiles regularly, we hold parent appointments in February/March and share an end of year report in June.

<u>Discussion with Teacher -</u> As well as taking part in activities with your child, you can also take the chance to have an informal chat with your child's teacher. If you have a specific matter to discuss that would require an individual appointment please let me know and this would be arranged for another time. I will also be available on this day if anyone has any questions or matters they wish to discuss.

<u>Checklist</u> - In order to make the day as efficient/worthwhile as possible your child will have a checklist of tasks that they must try to do whilst you are in visiting. There will be a main task on this sheet which should be completed. There is no pressure to complete all parts of the checklist.



<u>Organisation</u> - If you have more than one child in school we understand that this can be tricky for the open sessions but please try to prioritise the top learning task for each child. After having done this with your child in each class please feel free to gather your children for them to show you around different areas in school.

<u>Questionnaires</u> —Results of the most recent questionnaires collated in school are displayed near the office, are available on the website and were also shared via a newsletter. These are results from the Positive Relationships Questionnaire and the Learning Questionnaire from June 2022. A small school questionnaire for self-evaluation will also be requested on this day.

<u>Attend - Please</u> complete the Google Form to let me know that you will be attending so that we know in advance if your child will not have anyone coming to the open afternoon. We usually give any children in this position, a specific role on the day.

**Photos** - Small display of some photos in the middle area from events held in the last year.

<u>Achievements Board -</u> This board is continually updated as we share and learn of children's achievements within school and outwith school. Please help us by sharing your children's achievements with us at any time.

<u>End of your visit -</u> When you are leaving, you are welcome to take your child(ren) with you but you <u>must</u> let the class teacher know as this may be before the end of the normal day.

<u>Lost Property</u> - Good opportunity to view Lost Property items, there is an overflowing box at the moment.
